The output of Snowball Metrics



- The snowball metrics are set out in a 'recipe book' which sets out what they are and how to calculate them <u>www.snowballmetrics.com/metrics</u>
- Examples include:
 - Application volume
 - Income volume
 - Market share
 - IP Volume
 - Field Weighted Citation Impact
- Metrics can be 'sliced and diced' by funder type and by academic discipline, and normalised by FTE



Towards global standards for benchmarking



Snowball Metrics denominators should enable global benchmarking as far as possible.



Common core where benchmarking against global peers can be conducted. Aim is to make this as big as possible

Shared features where benchmarking between Countries 1 and 2 can be supported by shared or analagous data e.g. regional benchmarking

National peculiarity can support benchmarking within Country 1, but not globally i.e. national benchmarking

The Snowball Metrics Exchange service

Facilitates the exchange of **encrypted** Snowball Metrics between institutions who agree to share information

"I'll show you mine if you show me yours"



The Snowball Metrics Exchange service

- Any institution using Snowball Metrics can become a member of the Exchange service
- The service is **free of charge** to use
- Only **metric values** will be exchanged. Data underlying the metrics will never be exchanged and will remain behind the institutions' firewalls
- CRIS system could communicate directly with exchange service to upload and download metrics via APIs

OR

• Institutions can install the service on a server behind their firewall and then use **spreadsheets** to upload and download their metrics

Snowball Metrics

The Snowball Metrics Exchange service

- The institutional members are responsible for generating their own Snowball Metrics according to the recipes
 - Generate metrics using a management information system OR
 - Generate metrics on a spreadsheet
- Once registered with the service each institution can choose to be a member of **one or more** 'benchmarking clubs' or to exchange metrics via 'one to one' relationships with other members
 - Example benchmarking clubs:
 - UK Russell Group Universities
 - Members of Top 5-100 programme
 - A group of your own choosing
- Institutions may **choose** to accept or decline requests to share **all or some** Snowball Metrics institutions retain control of their metrics

The Snowball Metrics Exchange service

The Snowball Metrics Exchange service = Uploader + SMX + Downloader


Pre-requisites:

Institution A+B have added metric values to the Uploader e.g. Institution B - Scholary output 2015 = 1.376

&

Institution A+B have agreed to share encrypted metric values and have set up entitlements in the SMX

- 1. Institution A makes request through their Downloader to retrieve **Scholarly output 2015** from Institution B
- 2. SMX checks metric entitlements (see pre-requisites) and make request through the Institution B Uploader API Scholarly output 2015



- 5. Institution A downloads metrics and decrypts them through their Downloader e.g. Scholary output = 1376
- 4. SMX relays encrypted metric values to institution A's Downloader e.g. Scholary output = *&%\$
- 3. Uploader of Institution B sends encrypted metric values to the SMX e.g. Scholary output = *&%\$

Jenni Stergiou is responsible for this institutions metrics and has been verified.

The ticks and crosses on this page indicate which metrics you have entitled this institution to access. Clicking a cross turns it into a tick and entitles the institution to mutually share the chosen metric.

You can entitle the institution to mutually share a group of metrics (e.g. all input metrics) or to all metrics by clicking the radio buttons next to the metric group title. Remember to click on the blue 'save' button to save your changes.

Once you have made the selected metrics available in your 'Snowball Metrics uploader', this institution will be able to download and view them through their 'Snowball Metrics Downloader'

You can remove an institutions entitlement by clicking a tick which changes it to a cross. This will prevent any future download of the selected metric by this institution. Note that if you have previously entitled and uploaded the corresponding metric then the institution may have already downloaded the metric.

Only when both columns are ticked will the selected metric be able to be exchanged.


You can download an example CSV file here: count-of-applications.csv, for ease of use we have included the field names on the first row. Please make sure you delete this row before adding the metric.

To facilitate easier benchmarking between different countries, a shared classification for Funder and Subject area classifications has also been developed and can be found in the user guide.





Russell Group Benchmarking Agreement



- Agreement to share input & process metrics every 6 months:
 - Applications volume
 - Applications value
 - Awards volume
 - Awards value
 - Success rate volume
 - Success rate value

University of Leeds



- Agreed to share metrics with Russell Group
- Analysis to determine which other institutions we wish to approach
- Requests to share metrics from other UK & International institutions considered on basis of:
 - Whether they are a competitor (similar performance to Leeds or better) in one or more academic disciplines
 - Whether we may be interested in collaborating
- Using data from Snowball benchmarking agreement alongside other sources of data such as SciVal



Recap: Benefits for universities



- Trusted comparison of metrics on a robust standard (comparing apples to apples)
- Universities are in control
- Methods (recipes) are not proprietary
- Metrics are agnostic to systems or suppliers anyone can use them for their own purposes
- Ability to choose and control with whom one shares/benchmarks (the crossroad / traffic light model)
- Ability to benchmark nationally and internationally
